

A lucky Friday the 13th for 23 Job Seekers



Santa Ana, California (April 13, 2012) – Thanks to Aramark Sports and Entertainment, one of WHW’s (Women Helping Women/Men2Work) Job Partners, 23 job seekers received on the spot job offers on what is usually considered to be an unlucky day. From 9:00 am to 2:00 pm on Friday the 13th, Aramark conducted on-site interviews at WHW in search of cashiers, food prep, inventory and stocking personnel for Angel baseball games, offering positions to 23 of 25 applicants. The applicants were participants in WHW’s Job Club and Workforce Development Workshops which prepare disadvantaged job seekers to successfully enter the workforce.

Aramark Sports and Entertainment is WHW’s newest Job Partner, referred by their sister company, Aramark Uniforms. Three Aramark staff members conducted the interviews: Angelina Morgan, Human Resources Manager, Shane McClintock, General Manager and Presh Cox, Catering and Restaurant Manager. Mr. McClintock was particularly impressed with how prepared the applicants were, “We are not used to applicants that are so well prepared, it was refreshing.” Excited about building the partnership, Aramark is already planning ahead to conduct additional interviews for hockey season.
